SHOP ARTISTS JURY APPLICATION 2012**

**There is no deadline for submission; applications are accepted year-round for inclusion in the Avery Gallery.*

- In order to apply for the Avery Arts Council (AAC) Shop Artist jury process, you must be a current member of the Council. You may join at the time of submitting your application in order for it to be accepted for review. Individual membership is \$30 annually.
- Residents and part-time residents of the following counties may apply: **Avery, Mitchell, Yancey, Madison, Buncombe, Watauga, and Ashe.**
- All required support items must accompany the application: Artist bio and statement, signed contract, three or more examples of your work (images or physical examples), and 20 business cards. Incomplete application packages will not be accepted for review.

AVERY ARTS COUNCIL SHOP ARTIST CONTRACT

By signing this contract, I understand / agree that:

1. All works accepted into AAC's shop and galleries are on a consignment basis of a 40/60 split, wherein the AAC keeps 40% and the artist keeps 60% of the profits.
2. Commissions are paid on a monthly basis, no more than 30 days after the end of the month.
3. I currently reside in one of the applicable counties listed above and agree to notify the AAC to remove my work from the shop if I move out of the county.
4. I am a current member of the Avery Arts Council and I agree to keep my membership current as long as my work is represented by the AAC.
5. The Avery Arts Council will process all sales, withhold the commission, and North Carolina sales tax. Checks are issued to artists within 30 days after the end of the month. The AAC will also be responsible for passing on North Carolina Sales Tax to the state offices on schedule.

6. The AAC has an open policy about photographing items displayed in the gift shops. Unless notified in writing the Avery Arts Council assumes that permission is granted to photograph works for publicity, catalog, educational purposes, and documentation for the AAC website.
7. The Avery Arts Council does **not** have a non-compete policy. **Please be sure that selling your work in our gallery shop does not conflict or violate the language or spirit of any agreement you may currently have with another gallery.**
8. Shop artist inventory is not to be taken out by the artist unless it is for entry to an exhibition or competition. If an artist's inventory is removed by the artist repeatedly, it will be grounds for his/her work to be removed permanently from the Avery Gallery.
9. Upon acceptance to the gallery, you will be given a shop artist's code to use on your price tags and inventory sheet. These codes allow us to keep track of exactly what sold and report that information to you with each commission check.
10. **All inventory delivered to the gallery shop must be accompanied by an inventory list with prices, and must be individually tagged in the following order:**

Artist's Code – Inventory #
Item Name
Price

Example: John Doe is a woodworker who sells hand-carved walking sticks at the Avery Gallery for \$55 each. His tags would look like this:

JD-100
 Walking Stick
 \$55.00

Inventory numbers are assigned by the artist, and serve only to discern one item from another.

11. Please call before bringing new merchandise to the Avery Gallery. This best ensures you and your wares are given individualized attention.

12. I understand that if I am **not** juried into the gallery shop at this time, this contract is null and void.
